"Therefore, having his ministry by the mercy of God, we do not lose heart. But we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God." (2 Corinthians 4:1-2)

The Apostle Paul often wrote about the fact that his ministry was not one that he took upon himself or was even something that he sought after. Remember how the Lord worked to save Paul on the Road to Damascus? His apostolic ministry was given to him by God and Paul even notes here in 2 Corinthians that it was an act of God's mercy that he had that ministry. The ministry was an act of mercy to Paul as well as all those to whom he ministered. We could even say that Paul's ministry has been an act of God's mercy to we who believe today who are the beneficiaries of his letters and the spread of the Gospel in the churches that he served in various capacities.

God's mercy in providing Paul's ministry does not mean that it was without troubles. Paul himself was accused by the "super-apostles" (2 Cor. 11:5, 2 Cor. 12:11) of being a less than capable minister of the word of God. It seems that a regular accusation against him was that he was a poor speaker. That would be discouraging enough in itself. But also, the hardheartedness and unbelief of the people could have been discouraging to Paul. The Apostle experienced the same thing that preachers and teachers have experienced since then – disbelief at the message of the Gospel. But he focused on God's work and mercy in giving the ministry not on those who were rejecting it.

The response of unbelief at the preaching of the Gospel might cause some to attempt "disgraceful, underhanded ways." The idea seems to be things been done in a secret or hidden manner. The Apostle Paul and faithful ministers of the Gospel since then have always worked to openly state the truth and simply proclaim the message of Christ. The Gospel message is not one that should be presented as a manipulation of emotions or connected with a bait-and-switch.

Paul says that he has not just renounced these practices but now refuses to practice cunning or to

tamper with God's Word. The Apostle will not try to deceive anyone and trick them into turning to the truth. He is also adamant against tampering with God's Word. In Galatians, he speaks clearly about the importance of not trying to "adjust" the Gospel to make it more acceptable to some. In Galatians 1 he says, "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel- not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to distort the gospel of Christ. But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed. As we have said before, so now I say again: If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be accursed" (Galatians 1:6-9).

The Gospel is not something that can be twisted or distorted and remain the Gospel. The Good News of Jesus Christ is the only thing that saves. The Word of God is not something we try to devise plans to make it "better." The rightly preached and taught Gospel of Jesus Christ is to be openly taught and preached. The heartbreaking reality of this sinful world is that there are those who will not listen to the Gospel and will not believe God's Word. There can be a temptation for those preaching to try – with good intentions – to get more people to listen and more people to believe. However, the Lord's Word is that which brings life and forgiveness. Let us not forget Paul's words to the Galatians if we are listening or if we might be given an opportunity to speak God's Word to someone else.

The open preaching of God's Word is what allows it to be honestly discussed and examined by those who have not heard it before. False teachers of the ancient past and even in modern times have often spoken of their messages as being only for a secret select few. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is to be proclaimed to all the world. The repeated instruction of God's Word is that it is to be shared with all nations, with all peoples, and always until the Lord comes.

Let us pray that God would give us more opportunities to proclaim the Gospel to people who have not believed in the truth. Paul's desire is to commend himself to everyone's conscience by the open statement of the truth. May that be also our aim and goal. May the Lord work through the open statements of God's Word to bring more and more people to faith and peace with God. Amen.





