Hebrews 3:1-6 By Pastor Dennis Norby

Therefore, holy brothers, you who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession, who was faithful to him who appointed him, just as Moses also was faithful in all God's house. For Jesus has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses- as much more glory as the builder of a house has more honor than the house itself. (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.) Now Moses was faithful in all God's house as a servant, to testify to the things that were to be spoken later, but Christ is faithful over God's house as a son. And we are his house if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope.

As I am writing this, and it doesn't seem possible, we will soon be in the season of Lent. We have been experiencing some bitterly cold days, but Spring will be coming soon. The word "Lent" simply means "spring." During this season of the Church year, we take time to consider repentance and the work of Christ for us. Historically, Christians have also connected prayer, fasting, and giving to the poor as proper activities during this time.

The instruction giving in Hebrews 3 is a fitting one to consider as we begin the season. We read there, "Therefore, holy brothers, you who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession, who was faithful to him who appointed him, just as Moses also was faithful in all God's house" (v. 1-2). The author wants all who read or hear his letter, including you and me, to "consider Jesus." What he wants to encourage is that we observe, that we see, that we notice Jesus. Not consider, in the sense of weighing options. As if there is another one to whom we should look, for the whole book of Hebrews describes how there is really nothing and no one who compares to Jesus. The author of Hebrews says, "consider Jesus," look at how wonderful He is. He is faithful and true, righteous and merciful. This is the only place in the New Testament that Jesus is given the title, apostle, a sent one. He was sent from the glory of heaven by the Father to be our Redeemer. He is also described as a high priest. The characteristic that is pointed out in v. 2 is the faithfulness of Jesus. When we think of Jesus, we should think of one who was never negligent or incapable of fulfilling the task that the Heavenly Father had given Him. The Father sent Jesus, the Son, to be a priest. This is what Jesus did faithfully – He brought forth a sacrifice for our sins – Himself – offered on the cross of Calvary so that we might be saved. Jesus' service as a priest continues because He died and rose again. He is still faithfully serving as our high priest – always interceding for us (Hebrews 7:25).

To help see the greatness of Jesus the author brings up the Old Testament servant of God, Moses. Moses faithfully served the people of Israel and was viewed very highly by the people. But Moses' position, when considered alongside Jesus' position, was far less important. To help us understand that the author uses the imagery of a building and the builder of the house. Which one has more honor? The house or the builder? Of course, the answer is the builder. So, then Jesus – who is God in the flesh – and creator of all things should receive more honor than Moses – who is, in a sense, part of the building that God has created. None of this means that Moses was not faithful or to be respected but once again we should note – nothing and no one compares to Jesus. The author has compared Jesus to Moses not to demean Moses but to show that even a faithful servant like Moses is not worthy of the glory that Jesus deserves. The builder of all things is God – so we should keep our focus on Him – on the one who has created us and has provided for us a Savior – Jesus the faithful one. Our Heavenly Father wants to build for Himself a people – a house – and so Jesus came into the world that He might redeem lost sinners and give them eternal life.

We are so thankful for the faithful servants that God has raised up through history and those He has provided today. May He continue to do so more and more. But no matter how great the servants are and no matter how faithful they are – they cannot be worthy of more glory or honor than the One who created them – who sent them. This honor belongs to God Himself.

Moses led the people as a servant of God, but the author of Hebrews makes clear that Jesus is more than a servant in God's house. Jesus is the Son of God. In verse six the author writes, "but Christ is faithful over God's house as a son. And we are his house if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope." So, during this season of Lent, may we "consider Jesus" who is our faithful High Priest sent by God to create and sustain His Church. Let us repent and rejoice in God's mercy to us! Amen.






