Acts 2:41 So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls. 42 And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. 43 And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. 44 And all who believed were together and had all things in common. 45 And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. 46 And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, 47 praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

The book of Acts is Luke's carefully investigated history of the beginning of the church. It follows the history of Jesus Christ recorded in the Gospel of Luke and picks up where that book finished, by describing the resurrected Christ's ascension into heaven. Having heard about this we might ask, what did the Apostles and other followers of Jesus do after Christ ascended? Specifically, how did they interact with one another?

At the start of Acts 2, we have the amazing events of Pentecost recorded for us. The tongues of fire, the speaking in tongues, and Peter's sermon are all laid out for us. As Peter's message ends a number of people were "cut to the heart" as it says in verse thirty-seven. They asked Peter and the rest of the apostles what they should do, and Peter responded, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself" (v. 38-39).

Verse 41 tells us the astounding news that having heard that instruction from the apostles 3,000 were baptized that day. Then we have this summary statement of how the believers lived and interacted with one another. This description has been studied and meditated on by Christians since that time to determine how we might live and act like Christians. Having said that, we should remember that these are verses describing how they lived, not necessarily saying that in every respect we should mirror their actions. What can we learn and imitate from these early believers?

For our purposes here, we will look at two of the things they were devoted to. First, they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching. The apostles were Jesus closest followers, learning from Him directly and being encouraged in their faith in Him regularly as He taught, performed miracles, and loved them without fail. The teaching of the apostles was able to connect the promises of the Old Testament concerning the coming of the Messiah with the work and ministry of Jesus which had just happened. This devotion to the apostle's teaching is something vital to the life and wellbeing of Christians today as well. Without faithful teaching we will be lost. May the Christian church always stay devoted to the right and true teaching of God's Word.

The second thing mentioned in the passage is "the fellowship." The Greek word, koinonia, used here means "fellowship" or "participation." It speaks of a relationship characterized by sharing things in common. This is a beautiful word to describe what the relationship of the early believers looked like. They were sharing things in common. This is mentioned here in chapter 2 and also described to some extent in Acts 4:32 which says, "Now the full number of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one said that any of the things that belonged to him was his own, but they had everything in common" (also note v. 33-37).

They were devoted to one another! What a precious picture for us of the unity found in the life of the church. Richard Balge, in his commentary on Acts, says, "What prompted them to do this? We are not told that the apostles commanded them to do so or that they were trying to put some economic theory into practice. We can only conclude that they did it out of love for the Lord and for their brothers and sisters in Christ. They were devoted to the fellowship" (The People's Bible, p. 38).

Some have said that they find the teaching of communism in the Christians of that early church. However, communism is something forced or coerced. What these believers were doing was simply pouring out their love for one another in the manner which made the most sense to them. Voluntarily. There were those in their midst who were in need, and they had been graciously provided for by God. They saw that as an opportunity to shower others with love.

May the Lord Jesus cultivate in us a devotion to His Word as recorded in the books of the prophets and apostles. May the Lord provide for us an understanding of the needs of one another and clearly show us how we might encourage and strengthen our brothers and sisters in Christ through what God has first given to us. Amen.

Seed is cast to gather rain that in soils seep New life is born nourished by the unseen Until harvest comes to the faded green Growing to die and gathered by the reap'r.


With the heat life thrives and begins to swell By cold it is preserved, yet grows no more. While one is here, the other is wished for But both are present, eternal in hell.
