"Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" (Matthew 11:3) John the Baptist's question for Jesus summarized the expectancy of those waiting for the arrival of the Messiah, the promised King, the Immanuel. After the fall of humanity into sin thousands of years earlier, God promised that He would send a Savior. One who would crush the enemy and deliver them from sin. Later in Isaiah 7, God gave the name of this Savior, Immanuel, meaning "God with us" (Matt 1:23). God promised that He would come down to earth and be present among His people and save them. In Isaiah 61, God proclaimed how people would know who the Messiah was. He would "bring good news to the poor," "bind up the brokenhearted," "proclaim liberty to the captives," and open "the prison to those who are bound" (vs. 6). In Isaiah 29, God declared that when the Messiah comes, "the deaf shall hear," and "the eyes of the blind shall see" (vs. 18). This would be the Messiah's mission to earth. This is who He would be. With these miracles and works, the people would know that their King had come to earth, that God was with them.

After four hundred years of "silence" from God, years of occupation under various stifling rulers and authorities, and suffering under the oppression and affliction of sin, the people of God were waiting for this Messiah to come and save them and execute judgment on their enemies. And now they were wondering, could this Jesus really be the Messiah? Is He the one who has come to save us and set up His kingdom? John himself, sent by God to "prepare the way" (Matt 11:10) before Christ, wondered, is Jesus the One who is to come, or is there another?

John had been sent from God, "to bear witness about the light" (John 1:6-7). He baptized Jesus and confessed, "I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God" (Jn 1:34). But now he sat in prison wondering about these works of Christ he heard about. What was the work of the Messiah? Where is the salvation of the people from their oppressors? And so he sent his disciples to ask Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?"

Jesus' response to John revealed that the Messiah's work on earth was vastly different from what many expected. The Messiah didn't come to earth to judge the world, but to save it. Jesus responded, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have the good news preached to them. And blessed is the one who is not offended by me" (Matt 11:5-6). This was a proclamation of the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecies that the Messiah would come and enact these miracles and works. According to Isaiah 29 and 61, the Messiah's ministry would be one of proclaiming the good news of salvation and demonstrating His steadfast love by healing the blind and deaf.

Jesus tells John that this is exactly what He has been doing. He has been working miracles in people who are not only physically but also spiritually blind, deaf, sick, poor, and dead. He is the Messiah. He is the One who had been promised to them. There is not another. He has fulfilled the prophecies about Himself. And all these miracles and works point to what He was about to do. Isaiah 61:2 proclaimed that the Messiah would "proclaim liberty to the captives." As we read through the Gospels, we see that this proclamation of liberty wasn't a revolutionary war cry against earthly oppressors, but rather His death on the cross and resurrection from the dead! Through His death and resurrection, Jesus defeated our greatest enemies, sin, death, and the devil. He proclaimed victory over them and freed the captives!

Advent and Christmas season is a joyful time of the year because we focus on the truth that, yes, Jesus is the One who was to come! There isn't another. He appeared to us, lived among us, died, rose again, and still lives with us! He is Immanuel, God with us. Even now He still seeks the blind, deaf, sick, poor, and dead. He seeks those who have been blinded and infected by sin, those who close their ears to His Word, those who are poor in spirit, and those who are dead in their trespasses. He draws near to them, speaks to them in His Word, and calls them to Himself. He proclaims to them that He won the victory and that there is healing and life in Him. Christ has come to give sight to the blind, hearing to the deaf, healing of the sick, riches for the poor, and life to the dead.






