# 1 Corinthians 10:11-13 By Pastor Dennis Norby

Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come. Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall.

No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it. 1 Corinthians 10:11-13

Imagine for a moment, for some of you it will be more like "remember," a scene like this. Mom to son: "How many times am I going to have to tell you? Don't run in the house. Remember when your friend, Jimmy, did that and ended up tripping and hitting his head on the corner of the table. Remember how they had to take him to the hospital, and he had all those stitches. He still has that big scar. You don't want that to happen, do you?"

A rule has been stated, a negative example produced, and hopefully fear has been induced. At least that is what the mom is hoping will lead the son to obey the rule.

We have rules stated at the beginning of 1 Corinthians 10. Do not be idolaters. Do not be sexually immoral. Do not put Christ to the test. Do not grumble. We have the negative example of the people in the wilderness. They broke the laws of God and faced the consequences. There is no doubt that these things were written as examples to us for our instruction (v. 11).

The mom in the above scene knows that fear might keep her son from disobedience for a time. But she knows she has proclaimed the rule in the past and will have to proclaim it again in the future. The son keeps breaking the rule. The Apostle Paul knew that the people in Corinth had heard the law before, but he knew that they needed to hear it again. As we all do. The churches of today are more like the messed up Corinthian church than we would like to admit. The Law is important for us as well, we "on whom the end of the ages has come" (v. 11).

The Apostle Paul begins chapter ten by telling the Corinthians he did not want them to be ignorant of what God had done. It is true, he did not want them to be ignorant of God's laws, but he also most certainly did not want them to be ignorant of the Gospel. We have in the first few verses of this text a wonderful connection of the gifts that God gave to the people of Israel and the gifts of the sacraments for the Christian Church. The Apostle says those who passed through the Red Sea were baptized into Moses (note Ex. 14). The baptism into Moses was God's work of saving the people from slavery in Egypt through the waters. Baptism into Christ is God's work of saving people from slavery to sin through the waters. We also see a picture of the Lord's Supper when Paul speaks of the eating of spiritual food and drinking spiritual drink in the wilderness. It was no doubt a physical food that they ate. It sustained them from day to day. It was no doubt a spiritual food; it was from heaven, from God Himself. And so that we are not confused Paul makes clear that the spiritual Rock from which they drank was Christ.

Pride is such a dangerous sin it must be fought against whenever we see it. We who are God's people are to look at God's people in the past and consider how we can also fall. When we rightly assess the situation, we find that without Christ's help we will fall. The only way that we can stand is through Christ's strength and the only way we can get up again is through His mercy and forgiveness. The sins of the Hebrews in the desert were appalling. The sins of the Corinthians were terrible. The sins of God's people today are...just as bad. There are no excuses for the sins that we have committed. We cannot think, "I will stand where all others have fallen" (v. 12).

But by God's grace we see Jesus. The One whom God sent to stand up under the full weight of sin and never folded. The One who has proved God's faithfulness (v. 13). The One who was tempted in every way but remained without sin (Hebrew 4:15).

The temptation to run in the house might fade as we grow older (maybe the temptation to run anywhere) but the flesh, the world, and the devil will continue to bring forth temptations. They might look a little different or come in a different shape than they did before, but they will still come. When they do come, and we stand up under them recognize that we can do so only by Christ living through us (Galatians 2:20). And when we fall to temptation remember that Christ has provided a way of escape: Complete forgiveness of our sins by His finished work at Calvary. He washes us, he feeds us, he strengthens us...Jesus does it all. Thanks be to God. Amen.


