On October 31, we celebrate Reformation Day, the day commemorating the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. On this day in 1517, Martin Luther nailed a document, the Ninety-five Theses, to a church door in Wittenberg, Germany. In this document, Luther publicly declared that the Roman Catholic Church had been promoting false teachings.

Luther proclaimed that the Roman Catholic Church had been teaching a false salvation that comes through our own good works, rather than salvation through the grace of God. Instead of pointing people towards repentance and faith in Jesus Christ, they proclaimed that people must earn their salvation, therefore enslaving people to their own sinfulness.

The spread of the Ninety-five Theses started what we now call the Protestant Reformation, a return to the preaching and teaching of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ alone. We celebrate Reformation Day to this day because the Bible is clear that salvation is not something we earn; rather, it is a gift from God. This is a gift of justification and the righteousness of God.

Luther discovered this great Gospel truth as he was studying Romans 1:17, which speaks of the righteousness of God. What Luther discovered was that the righteousness of God is not a frightening pronouncement of judgment like the Catholic Church had taught him. He discovered that justification is not something to work tirelessly for, but rather a gift that God offers to all people to be received by faith.

Romans 3:19-28 speaks clearly to this Gospel truth. Verse 20 states, "For by works of the law no human being will be justified in His sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin" [ESV]. The law shows us our sin. Through the law, the commands of God, we see where we fall short. Every day we fail at keeping God's command. We don't love God as we should. We don't love other people as we should. Our sinfulness keeps us from obeying God's law. This verse is clear that no attempt at keeping God's law can justify us before God, the great Judge.

But God's heart isn't to destroy us, it's to save us. As the great Judge over His law, God doesn't desire to condemn you to destruction; He desires to save you and give you peace. He desires to proclaim a declaration of forgiveness to you. His heart is to draw you into a right standing with Him. Therefore, He proclaims a statement of justification to you, a proclamation that you are in a right standing with Him. That all costs of your shortcomings are covered. That every penalty that you incurred has been paid. Romans 3 tells us how this is done. Verse 22 states that we are "... justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus..."

The phrase "as a gift" is critical. God offers this justification to you as a gift. This means that nothing you do can earn this proclamation of justification. We can do nothing to earn this salvation. Our good works won't earn us this justification, because it is a gift. It is offered to us to be received by faith in Jesus Christ.

This gift wasn't without a cost, though. This gift of justification is possible, not because of our own works, but because of the work of Christ Jesus, "whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith" (v. 25). God's law requires payment for our shortcomings. The reality is that we should be the ones to pay for our shortcomings with our own lives. But God loves us so much that He sent Jesus Christ to pay for our shortcomings with His own blood. His blood paid for our sin. His blood is the reason that God gives us this gift of justification.

With this awesome news of salvation, we now live in the joy and freedom of Christ. We don't live under the slavery to our sin like the Roman Catholic Church falsely taught. We don't have to live every day trying to appease a terrifying Judge with our works. We live as already justified by the blood of Jesus Christ. When we fall short of God's commands, we don't despair and hide from God. We don't try to win God's favor again with more sinful works. Instead, we repent of our sin and trust in Jesus Christ who died and rose again for us.

This is the Gospel that we proclaim at Grace and Zion. Reformation Day is a reminder that salvation is through faith in Jesus Christ alone. We don't listen to the temptation to run back to our old lives or back to our own good works. The Bible teaches us clearly that God offers us salvation through Jesus Christ as a gift. We can't earn it. This is good news for every single one of us!

The Home Missions Department serves as the church planting ministry of the AFLC. Home Missions works to plant and renew free, living and Lutheran congregations.

FREE

- GOSPEL: We make disciples by proclaiming the powerful gospel message—that Jesus Christ lived in perfect obedience to the Father, was crucified for our sin, was resurrected by the power of the Holy Spirit, ascended into heaven, and will one day return to make all things new. We celebrate that his grace and forgiveness grant us true freedom to live with peace, joy, and hope.
- CONGREGATION: We believe that the congregation is where God's Kingdom is manifested and experienced in this world. We cherish that the congregation is free to be led by God's Word and Spirit. We gladly cooperate in Gospel mission with other like-minded congregations for the salvation of souls.

- BAY BROADCASTING operates KAKN, a commercial non-profit FM Christian radio station that serves the Bristol Bay area around Naknek. Listen to KAKN online at kakn.org or stream via Tunein.com.
- THE NET is an internet coffee house in Naknek where coffee and baked goods are free and people from all over the world hear about the free gift of salvation.




